Dear Parents and Carers,

Class teachers will start providing home learning next week. This will be through Teams for P3-7 and SEESAW for P1 and 2. These activities are entirely optional and reinforce the learning that has taken place in the class. Infant classes may be provided with worksheets or books to record some of the tasks but these should stay at home. There is also no need to submit work through TEAMS or SEESAW.

We understand the pressures that families are under after school with clubs and other family commitments. We hope that our home learning policy helps you to support your child with their learning without being pressured with time constraints. I have attached an overview and guidance to this email. Primary 3 will be accessing home learning through TEAMs and not SEESAW and there is information provided within the policy which will support you, however if you have any issues, please contact the school office and will we try and help.

Our first whole school event, **Meet the Teacher**, will take place Tuesday 19th of Sept. The aim of this event is to allow your child to take you on a tour of the building and their class. Class teachers will be in each class to welcome you and there will be a range of activities and materials on display in each class in order for you to gain an insight into the learning that will take place this year. There will also be a class newsletter and other information for you to take away.

Meet The Teacher will start at 3.15pm and we would ask that you enter and exit the building through the doors your child normally enters, for example class doors or stairwells. The main hall and admin corridor should not be accessed as we have a private let in the hall. A bell will ring at 4.15pm which will indicate the end of the event and I would respectfully ask that you leave the building at this time. Please note that all children should be under the supervision of their parents during this event and not be in any area unaccompanied. Class newsletters and other information will be posted on our website for those parents who are unable to attend.

Unfortunately, a number of parents are using the staff car park at the beginning of the school day, this is not only preventing staff from accessing the car park but vehicles reversing and parking at the barrier are now putting our children at risk. If you require disabled access you may access the driveway prior to 8.45am otherwise there should be no unauthorised vehicles accessing this area.

Finally, can I take this opportunity to remind P3, P4 and P7 parents to complete the online form issued regarding Sacraments. This will indicate whether the class teacher should start preparing your child for their Sacraments this year.
