Children will be taught a range of writing genres. They will write to

- -explain processes
- -persuade
- -explore issues
- -express an opinion

They will use VCOP (Vocabulary,

Connectives, Openers, Punctuation)

to assess and up-level their writing.

Learning in Primary 3

The children will continue to learn in a variety of different ways.

As well as teacher led class and group learning the children will have independent targets to complete. These targets may take the form of a written task, a game or a practical activity.

There will also be longer term challenges which will be led by the children and completed in groups.

Numeracy and Maths

Teaching and learning in maths will include active learning, practical activities, problem solving and enquiry and focused numeracy development. This includes the SEAL (Stages of Early Arithmetical Learning) programme which is an active approach to number where learners experience activities which are varied, differentiated, active, and provide effective support and challenge. It is designed to develop numeracy skills and build confidence.
